



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE 4/20/2007

URGENT ACTION NEEDED! The Association has learned that action may be taken on **H.3726 (DISSOLUTION)**, The bill provides that a SPD could be dissolved by resolution of the Governing Body without regard to the desires of the citizens receiving the service, financial considerations or governance of the district.

At this time, the House Special Laws Subcommittee has taken no action on the bill; however we believe with the May 1st cross-over deadline rapidly approaching, attempts to fast track **H.3726** will be made. We are concerned that a unanimous consent request will be made to withdraw **H.3726** from the House Special Laws Subcommittee and place the bill on the uncontested House Calendar.

Please contact your House Member and urge them *to object* to any attempts to fast track H.3726. Doing away with a local government is serious business and needs serious study.

H 3726 General Bill, By Cato, Bannister, G.R. Smith, Bedingfield, Allen, Leach, Rice and Haskins

A BILL TO AMEND THE CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976, BY ADDING SECTION 6-11-2025 SO AS TO ALLOW THE GOVERNING BODY OF A SPECIAL PURPOSE DISTRICT TO VOLUNTARILY DISSOLVE ITSELF AND TRANSFER ITS ASSETS AND LIABILITIES TO A COUNTY IF ACCEPTED BY RESOLUTION OF ITS GOVERNING BODY.

"Section 6-11-2025. Notwithstanding the provision of this article, the governing body of a special purpose district, by resolution, may transfer all of its assets and liabilities to the governing body of a county. The provisions of this section are applicable only if the governing body of the county adopts a resolution agreeing to the terms of the resolution and the provisions of Section 6-11-2140 are followed."

SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon approval by the Governor.
